KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Andrea Boggild



Dr. Boggild is an Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine at the University of Toronto, and is the Medical Director of the Tropical Disease Unit in the Division of Infectious Diseases at Toronto General Hospital. In addition, she is the Parasitology Lead for the Public Health Ontario Laboratory. She is a licensed Medical Microbiologist and Infectious Diseases physician, who provides care to patients with travel-acquired infectious diseases in her medical practice.

As a Clinician Scientist in the Department of Medicine, she leads ongoing international research and clinical collaborations in the fields of leishmaniasis, malaria, and travel and migration health, and through this work has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles and several book chapters. She presently serves on the Editorial Board of Travel Medicine and Infectious Disease, as an Associate Editor for the Journal of Travel Medicine, and as the Tropical, Travel, and Emerging Infections Section co-editor for Current Infectious Disease Reports. She is a member of the Committee to Advise on Tropical Medicine and Travel (CATMAT), an external advisory body to the Public Health Agency of Canada, and is the Director of Epidemic Intelligence and Surveillance for CanTrayNet, The Canadian consortium of GeoSentinel Surveillance Network sites.

Dr. Stan Houston

MD DTM&H FRCPC

Professor of Medicine & Public Health Director, Northern Alberta HIV Program



Dr. Houston did his medical training in his native Saskatchewan and subsequently trained in Family Medicine, Tropical Medicine, Internal Medicine and Infectious Disease. He practiced primary care in northern Saskatchewan and rural Lesotho, Africa and taught and practiced at the University of Zimbabwe for 4 years. He consulted for over a decade with the National TB Program of Ecuador and for a similar time as a TB consultant to Doctors without Borders in South Sudan. Locally, he practices Internal Medicine and Infectious Disease at the U of A and directs the Northern Alberta HIV Program. Other activities have included CATMAT membership, The Canadian TB Standards, involvement in starting the New Canadians Clinic and of course, acting as an advisor to Travellers Health Services and AATHP.

Dr. Michael Hawkes

BEng, McGill U; MD, U of Alberta; PhD, U of Toronto; DTM&H, Peru; FRCPC
Pediatrics and Infectious Diseases



Michael Hawkes is a clinician-scientist at the University of Alberta. In addition to a clinical practice in consultant Pediatric Infectious Diseases at the quaternary Stollery Children's Hospital, he leads a translational research program in global pediatric infections. Diseases of focus include some of the leading infectious disease killers of children in the world today: malaria, pneumonia, and HIV. He holds peer reviewed grants (CIHR, Grand Challenges Canada, Li Ka Shing Institute of Virology) that support basic science research, epidemiologic studies, and clinical trials. He operates field sites in Uganda, the Democratic Republic of Congo, with collaborative research projects in the Philippines. He has more than 50 peer-reviewed publications, which have been cited over 1000 times in the medical literature. His research is improving outcomes in children with serious infections in some of the least developed areas of the globe.

Dr. Stephen Vaughan



Dr. Stephen Vaughan is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Infectious Disease at the University of Calgary. He received his Medical Doctorate degree in 2007 from the Memorial University of Newfoundland followed by completing his Residency in Internal Medicine & Fellowship in Infectious Diseases at the University of Calgary. In 2012, he completed a Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene at the University of Cayetano Heredia de Peruana in Lima, Peru, followed by a Certificate in Tropical Medicine from the American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene. Dr. Vaughan also develops guidelines on Committee to Advise on Tropical Medicine and Travel (CATMAT), and is the founder of the National Tropical Infectious Diseases Rounds.

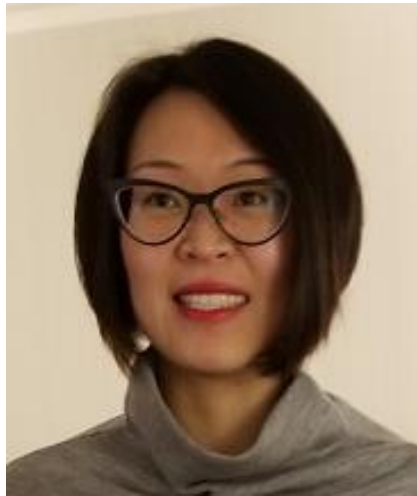

Current areas of interests include clinical research in the area of Hepatitis C antiviral therapy, new vaccines, teaching and presenting. Recent publications in peer reviewed journals include the New England Journal of Medicine, Lancet, Journal of Clinical Infectious Diseases, CMAJ, Gut, Hepatology and Open Medicine.
